261 Fearless is an international, non-profit network of women dedicated to supporting each other through non-competitive running. It is named "261 Fearless" because Kathrine Switzer, the first woman to officially run the Boston marathon (in 1967) wore bib number 261. The race director spotted her on the course and tried to rip off her bib and physically remove her from the course, angry that a woman would dare participate in a marathon! Kathrine completed the race, becoming a symbol of women's strength in running. Fifty years after Kathrine's historic Boston marathon, in April 2017, at the

age of 70, Kathrine Switzer ran the Boston marathon again. This time she ran along with a team of 261 Fearless women runners from around the world, including Herbster resident Pat Murphy, an avid marathoner who is passionate about running and its power to transform people's lives.

Pat Murphy thought the 261 Fearless non-competitive approach to encourage women to run, walk and be fit made a lot of sense and decided to bring it to the South Shore. After attending 261 Fearless coach training, getting
